The Narrogin Wind Farm is a proposed 200 MW renewable energy project comprising up to 25 wind turbines. Situated on freehold land approximately 7km east of Williams and 10km west of Narrogin in Western Australia, it will utilise the region's strong wind resources to deliver affordable, clean electricity.

The project, which may include a large battery in the future. The project will connect to the South West Interconnected System via an existing 220 kV transmission line.



Project updates



EPA Environmental Approval

Neoen received formal approval from the WA Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) on 6 January 2025.



EPBC DCCEEW

Neoen received formal approval from the Federal Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act, managed by Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water on 2 May 2025.



Development Application

A Development Application has been submitted to the State Government. Public consultation opens from 1 May 2025.

Geotechnical Investigation

On-site geotechnical surveys are currently underway and are expected to conclude in early May.



Cultural Heritage

An Aboriginal Cultural Heritage survey is scheduled for May and June. This will be the final on-site survey ahead of construction.



Work with us

Construction is expected to commence as early as 2026. In the lead-up, Neoen will host a local jobs information session to engage with the community and identify employment opportunities.

The Narrogin Wind Farm is expected to create approximately 250 new jobs during construction and up to 15 new, permanent positions during operations. Neoen focuses first on hiring local people for projects.
